Use of Pupil Premium 2014 - 2015

Background

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after by the local authority continuously for more than six months.

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils from low income families. From September 2012, we are required to publish online information about how we have used the Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the Premium and the extra support that pupils receive.

St Cuthbert Mayne Catholic Primary School Funding

In 2014-2015 St Cuthbert Mayne Catholic Primary School received £15,130 for Pupil Premium. Other funding from additional funding streams was added to this money to ensure that we could support all of our most disadvantaged pupils.
