Welcome to St George's Class

School uniform

We have been delighted to see how smart the children have been looking. Please ensure that you follow the school uniform policy and all items of uniform are clearly labelled.

PE

We have 2 PE sessions each week, although we do ask that all children have their PE kit in school every day in case of changes to the timetable. Our regular PE session takes place on a Tuesday.

We walk to swimming every Thursday afternoon, children will bring home their PE kit home on a Wednesday night in order to wear it to school on a Thursday. This should be correct kit of grey jogging bottoms (not leggings), school t-shirt/polo shirt, trainers and a waterproof coat. A warm hat to wear walking to and from the pool would also be a good idea. For the girls I would also recommend swimming hats so we can avoid wet hair dripping down our backs on the walk back to school!

Water

We are encouraging the children to drink plenty of water. Please could each child bring a named water bottle which will be kept in class to school each day ensuring that the children have access to water all day.

Snack for Break time - in Juniors children have to provide their own healthy snack for break, please make sure these are labelled with their names to avoid any confusion.

Pencil cases

Children are allowed pencil cases in Year 3 however they are not necessary as pens and pencils are provided. Please ensure that pencil cases are small enough to fit in a tray.

Home learning

Children will receive two pieces each week, Maths is given via www.mymaths.co.uk on a Thursday to be completed online by the following Tuesday. One other piece of work will be sent home with the due date printed on it. Children should spend no longer than 20 minutes on their homework. If your child is unable to complete the homework please send in a letter to explain why.

Reading

Your child should be reading to themselves and/or aloud to you or another adult every day. It would also be great if they could read with you so that they can listen to you read as often as possible, this also allows them to read more challenging texts. They should record when and what they have read in their Reading Diary together with a comment about the book - if they enjoyed it, if they struggled etc.
