Dear parents and carers,

As we embark on a new term at St Cuthbert Mayne, we are deeply saddened by the news of the death of her Majesty the Queen. She embodied a level of lifelong service and dedication that is an example we admire hugely.

It is important that we respectfully mark this moving and historic moment in our nation's history with the children, to help them understand what they will observe and experience in the days and weeks to come. The children have spent some time today reflecting on the invaluable contribution that Her Majesty has made to our country and celebrating her life. We'd like to share with you the prayer that has been released by the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales at this time:

In Phonics lessons children in Year 1 and 2 have been getting to grips with 'Read Write Inc'; more on that later in the newsletter.

It has been a momentous week in terms of news headlines; who would have thought that the appointment of a new Prime Minister could be so quickly forgotten as we learned of the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. I was struck by Liz Truss' statement which described her as the 'the rock on which modern Britain was built.' just a few hours earlier the children had listened to St Matthew's Gospel in Collective Worship and heard Jesus describe Peter as the rock of the church. I am sure there will be many opportunities over the coming weeks for us to reflect on the life of this incredible lady.

IMPORTANT: CHANGES TO KS1 HOME READING

As you may be aware, towards the end of the last academic year we began to redevelop the reading provision at school. This year we are really focusing on how we teach reading.

We have invested in a new reading scheme to help pupils in **Reception, Year 1 and Year 2** develop fluent and confident decoding skills, as well as an understanding of what they are reading. The scheme also supports children throughout the school as they develop their reading fluency. The scheme, called **Read Write Inc**, ensures that the books which your child reads at home directly relate to the sounds (phonics) which they learn in class.

For the first two weeks of this academic year, your child will only bring home a 'Sharing Book' (intended to be read with an adult), this is while we assess the children and establish the different reading groups.

Book Bags

In order for this program to work, the children must have their book bags in school every day. By Friday, 16 September your child will also be given a Read Write Inc 'Book Bag Book' in addition to their 'Sharing Book'. Both of these books could be fiction or non-fiction.

Children will be expected to read their 'Book Bag Book' each day and develop their fluency; they should read it at least three times. The first time they read a new book, they are learning to read each word and to develop fluency; the second time, they are developing their expression and the third time they develop their reading comprehension.



Please ensure that you record the name of the 'Book Bag Book' and the dates on which the book was read in their Reading Record.

Colours and Book Bands

Please do not focus on the Read Write Inc colour band as they have their own colour band system, which does not match our old colour band system.

Parent Workshop

There will be a parent workshop on **26 September at 2.30pm.** We would encourage you to attend so that you can learn more about this new scheme and how best to support your child with their reading at home.
