It's a crisp Thursday morning, and I'm beginning to piece together this week's newsletter with a clear blue sky visible over my left shoulder. I'm grateful for this fine start to the day as I consider the prospect of leading the Rosary in the playground in an hour's time. October 7 is the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary and hence this month is set aside as a special month of devotion to Mary. The Rosary is a different lens through which to view some of the important moments of Jesus' life and its meditative nature is a peaceful way for our children to start the school day.

While a large group of children began their day with the Rosary on Tuesday, Year 5 children were piling onto a coach to head to the Winchester Science Museum. Although I wasn't able to join them for the trip, I visited them in their lesson the following day to hear them describe the Rocket ship Workshop which involved a rocket powered by methylated spirit flying across the room - more details in the newsletter. Thank you to Ms Halahan for organising the trip and to Mrs Huggon, Ms. Austin and Ms. Horobin for accompanying the children.

Read Write Inc continues to dominate our morning routine as the children hone their phonics skills. The scheme ensures a thorough understanding of the different combinations of letters which form the English language; not only does it teach children to read, but it provides them with strategies for decoding unfamiliar words and how to spell them! YEAR 5 ST CATHERINE'S CLASS ARE SCIENTISTS

On Tuesday 4th October, St Catherine's class visited the Winchester Science Centre and Planetarium. Linking their science learning with the English class reader 'Cosmic', we explored how rockets are designed and discovered more facts about our Solar System.





The children had fun watching their rockets blasting across the room, recognizing the importance of aerodynamic designs and the energy required to launch rockets into the air.

We were amazed by the night sky during the Planetarium show, which highlighted the amazing variety of constellations and the wondrous size of the Universe compared to our Solar System. During the afternoon, we gained an insight into what it would be like to train to become an astronaut.
