As one member of staff joins, regrettably I have to inform you that Mrs Grazier leaves us this week to begin the next stage of her career as she joins The Acorn Nursery. Mrs Grazier has done so much incredible work with the children of St Cuthbert Mayne, both supporting in the classroom and with small groups—we wish her well in her new role and look forward to welcoming her back as a parent and volunteer.

E-safety Event:

Technology continues to change at a startling rate. The internet and social media are such powerful sources of information and communication, but must be navigated with great care particularly by young people. Our children learn about how to stay safe online as part of their curriculum, but in order to further strengthen their understanding we have arranged for a series of workshops around e-safety for children in Key Stages 1 & 2 next Tuesday. I would encourage parents to try to attend one of the two sessions on Tuesday at 2.15pm or 5.15pm. The sessions delivered to parents will help prepare their children for a safer life online. ONLINE SAFETY EVENT



All schools aspire to safeguard their students. They take seriously how students treat themselves and each other both online and offline. Sharon Girling OBE visits schools to present and offer advice to the staff, students and parents on how the online activities of young people not only affects them today but will impact their future.

Presentation outline

Young people are using the internet on a daily basis. They change where they go online and the games they play and use regularly. It is therefore vitally important that parents are equipped with the knowledge and understanding they need to keep their children safe across these wide range of online environments and situations. In some instances, a young person's online presence will define their offline lives. The choices about the information they share and how they behave online has consequences for their safety, their education, their wellbeing and other life experiences. The sessions delivered to parents will help prepare their children for a safer life online.

The information provided during the parents evening with enable parents continue the learning at home.

Presentation

The information provided during the parents evening will link to the presentation given to their child and will enable parents to continue the learning at home. It will include all or some of the following:

- Online facts identifying young people's vulnerabilities;
- An understanding of what young people do online and the aspects of the activity they enjoy;
- What to look out for as young people engage in online gaming both from a user and parent perspective;
- Explanation of current games and some tips for parents
- An understanding of the basic rules of social networking and how to use it safely;
- An explanation of Facebook, Snapchat, TikTok, Instagram, Twitter; WhatsApp, and other current applications used by our young people;
- How to set up your devices with step-by-step guides;
- Useful resources, solutions and top tips.

The presentation is for a period of 60-75 minutes.

Presenter

Sharon Girling OBE is a former police officer who retired following thirty years' service. She was at the forefront of a national and international response to online child abuse and developed the processes and procedures that led to the creation of Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre. Her final role was as an investigator at the CEOP. Sharon is currently delivering training programmes for schools, Premier League Football Clubs, The Scouts Association, law enforcement, charities and businesses both nationally and internationally.

Sharon has been awarded an OBE by Her Majesty The Queen for her services to policing the internet

SAFEGUARDING REMINDER

It will come as no surprise to hear that the children's safety is paramount. As such we cannot allow parents or carers to enter the school building without having signed in at the school office first. Please adhere to the following guidelines:

Reception: please drop your children with the teacher at the gate to the EYFS playground.

Year 1: either drop your children at the main school gate or accompany them to the start of the passageway by the bike shelter.

Year 2 and above: please drop your children at the main school gate.

Of course we understand that occasionally children might want to be accompanied a little further or might need some help putting their bike or scooter away - please try to remember to mention this to me or the member of SLT on the gate.

If you need to pass a message to your child's teacher in the morning then please mention this to me or the member of SLT on the gate or to the office staff. If you feel that you might need to have a longer conversation with the class teacher then please make an appointment by contacting the office. The end of the school day is probably an easier time to have a brief conversation with your child's teacher if necessary.

POSITIVE AND RESPECTFUL PARKING


We continue to be very grateful to all our parents that park and stride/cycle/walk to school, and to those that park safely and respectfully around the neighbouring roads.

Rule 243 of the Highway Code states that road users must not park near a school entrance; for the safety of all the children at St Cuthbert Mayne, we would ask that all members of our community adhere to this rule and do not park on the yellow zig-zag lines.

PUPIL PREMIUM (PP)

Pupil Premium is additional funding to raise the attainment of particular pupils of all abilities and to close the gaps between them and their peers.

At St. Cuthbert Mayne, we believe that the highest possible standards can only be achieved by having the highest expectations of all learners. Some pupils from particular backgrounds require additional support; therefore, we will use all the resources available to help them reach their full potential.

When your child starts at our school, we ask you to complete a form in order for us to assess eligibility, however, we are fully aware that family circumstances may have changed since then. We would therefore encourage all families to review the form again and thus enable us to identify any further children who may be eligible to PP funding. The forms themselves also contain information about eligibility criteria.

Ukrainian Appeal

The children preparing to make their First Holy Communion were invited to physically contribute to this appeal but it was suggested that the whole parish might like to be involved. We are very aware that we all have many demands on our income at the moment so please remember that prayers are also very important and make a vital contribution if that is how you choose to support this request.

The Diocese has a wonderful Ukrainian priest serving the parish of Walton on Thames and he has been transporting goods to Ukraine since the beginning of the war. They have been supporting an orphanage in the Western part of the country which has taken children from the fighting in the East. Aside from the displacement and loss they have suffered, the winter is coming and without electricity they are struggling with the cold. We can help by providing **NEW** hats/gloves/scarves/ thick socks for any age child up to 20. We encouraged the FHC children to think of a present they might like someone to buy for them this Christmas and to consider if they could instead buy that for a Ukrainian child. Please leave everything unwrapped as it may need to be examined.
