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How do I contact the Home School Link Worker?

Parents/carers, schools and children can ask us to become involved. With your consent we will explore the difficulties your child is experiencing and identify the best way forward.

Fill in the HSLW message form enclosed and hand into the school office in an envelope For the Attention of the Home School Link Worker, marked "Private" OR email/telephone your school's HSLW. (See front of leaflet for contact details).

What can I expect?

Your HSLW will fill in a referral form with you. Before starting to work with children we will obtain your consent. We are able to offer a confidential service regarding personal issues. If necessary we would seek your permission to share the information with staff at the school or with other agencies. Should a Child Protection issue be identified we are legally bound to follow Government Guidelines.

Our aim is to ensure that all children enjoy school and are happy and secure.

We can help by providing...

- One to one support and advice
- Therapeutic sessions with children and families
- Signposting to other agencies
- Support Groups for Parents/Carers

Who can we help?

- Children who are withdrawn or anxious.
- Parents/Carers experiencing difficulties in managing their child's behaviour.
- Parents/Carers whose children are not attending school or who have been excluded.
- Parents/Carers and children who are reacting to change, such as parental separation or bereavement.
- Parents/carers who may need support on a wide range of issues impacting on their family life e.g. illness, separation, domestic violence, bereavement.
